## Section W-1B Election Procedures

Nominations for Section office may be made by any Lodge Chief, or his designee, when nominations are declared open at the Conclave Business meeting. Nominations shall require no second. Nominations for each office shall be closed only once just before balloting for that office.

After the nominations for a given office are declared closed, the Lodge Chiefs shall poll their delegates who are under **21** years of age to determine how the Lodge shall cast its votes. Such a poll shall be taken before each ballot.

Each Lodge represented by at least one youth member may cast ten (**10**) votes for each office on all ballots. The Lodge shall cast its ten votes in proportion to the poll of its delegates (in whole votes, no fractions). The Section Chief, in consultation with his Section Advisor and/or Area Director, has final authority to determine any questions about whether a delegation is officially representing a Council at a Conclave. Such judgements shall be based on the competent

authority, such as written or verbal certification by the Lodge Advisor, Staff Advisor or Council Executive of the Council in Question. In no case shall adults vote or cast ballots for a Lodge.

A nominee must receive a majority (one vote more than fifty percent (**50%**)) of the votes cast on a given ballot to be elected. Where a majority is not achieved, the nominee(s) receiving the least number of votes is (are) dropped and another ballot is taken. This procedure continues on until one nominee achieves a majority and is declared elected, or until two ballots in succession result in tie votes and the balloting is declared deadlocked.

When balloting is declared deadlocked, the Section Chief will announce to the voting delegates that one more ballot will be taken to break the tie, and if another tie results, he shall cast sufficient votes for the nominee of his choice to achieve a majority and declare him elected
