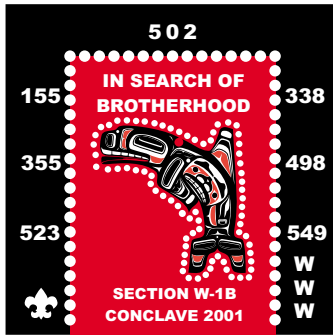

TEAQUAN WASK UNIVERSITY

This section of the Registration Form is where you select the college and courses you are attending at Conclave. Please refer to the Course Description to make sure you are following the requirements to receive the degree you are working towards.

COURSE DESCRIPTIONS

This year marks the second year of Section W-1B's Teaquan Wask University (TWU). At Conclave, you will have the opportunity to attend three courses from one college or one course from three different colleges. If you fulfill the requirements specified by the college you choose to attend, you will earn an Associate Degree from that particular college. If you earn an Associate Degree this year, you will receive a diploma including a TWU Associate Degree patch. If you come back next year, you can add on to your Associate Degree by earning a Bachelor's Degree and you will receive a diploma and a TWU Bachelor's Degree patch. If you return a third year, you can earn a Master's Degree and receive a diploma with a TWU Master's Degree patch. After you have your TWU Master's Degree, you can return for a fourth year and if you are either a Professor or Professor's Assistant, you will receive a Doctorate Degree and a TWU Doctorate Degree patch.

Below are all the courses that TWU is offering this year. First, select a college to take your courses from. Then, select three courses from the college you chose, making sure that you follow all requirements to earn a degree in that college. Then, fill in your course selections on the Teaquan Wask University Course Schedule section of the registration form.

CEREMONIAL COLLEGE (CC)

This college is designed for those Arrowmen that are currently active or interested in becoming active in Ceremonies. To earn a Ceremonial College Associate Degree you must take CC 100 and two courses from the list below.

CC 100: PREPARING YOUR CEREMONY TEAM FOR PERFORMANCES

This required course will have a positive impact on you and your entire ceremonies team. Being taught by Arrowmen who have judged on the National level, you will learn key tips to helping your team perfect your performance and produce a more inspiring ceremony.

CC 110: LEARNING YOUR CEREMONY PART AND BECOMING YOUR CHARACTER

This class is designed for the more beginning ceremony members. You will learn insights on how to memorize your part and tips on how you and your gestures will better depict your character.

CC 120: STAGING CEREMONIES

Need help with the appearance of your team? After this course you will have great knowledge in your site layout, dress and regalia, and basic stage acting.

CC 130: CHOKER NECKLACES

This hands on course is dedicated to helping you make a choker necklace. But with this course comes a small fee, which is \$10-\$15, depending on the extent of your necklace.

COLLEGE OF LODGE MANAGEMENT (CLM)

This college is designed for those Arrowmen that are currently active or interested in becoming active on the Lodge level. To earn a College of Lodge Management Associate Degree you must take CLM 100 and two courses from the Lodge Management or General Studies courses listed below.

CLM 100: LODGE PUBLIC RELATIONS

Does your Lodge need a face-lift? Enhance the image of your Lodge to members, non-members and your local Council.

CLM 110: FUNDAMENTALS OF SUCCESSFUL LODGE EVENTS

This course will help anyone gain insight into improving the quality and success of your lodge events. From the fine points of a menu to the excitement of special event activities, this course can help all Arrowmen, regardless of their experience level.

CLM 120: ORDEAL MANAGEMENT GAME

This course will help anyone gain insight into improving the quality and success of your lodge events. From the fine points of a menu to the excitement of special event activities, this course can help all Arrowmen, regardless of their experience level.

CLM 130: INCREASING YOUR BROTHERHOOD CONVERSION

It may seem impossible, but the Brotherhood Conversion rate for the National Quality Lodge Requirements is not impossible. Learn how to achieve it by going to this course.

CLM 140: UNIT REPRESENTATIVE PROGRAM

Learn about the benefits of the OA Troop Representative program for your Chapter and Troops, and learn how to support and develop the representative.

COLLEGE OF CHAPTER MANAGEMENT (CCM)

This college is designed for those Arrowmen that are currently active or interested in becoming active on the Chapter level. To earn a College of Chapter Management Associate Degree you must take CCM 100 and two courses from the Chapter Management or General Studies courses listed below.

CCM 100: CHAPTER, SET, HIKE

What does football and running your Chapter have in common? If you come to this course, you will see that it is a lot more than you think.

CCM 110: TOOL TIME FOR CHAPTERS

This course will help you develop Chapter improvement ideas for creating enthusiasm and participation through effective leaders.

CCM 120: UNIT ELECTION TRAINING

Need help with your Unit Elections? Understand the unit election policies, get the answers in the problem areas that you might run into while conducting elections, and be able to conduct a successful unit election.

CCM 130: INCREASING YOUR BROTHERHOOD CONVERSION

It may seem impossible, but the Brotherhood Conversion rate for the National Quality Lodge Requirements is not impossible. Learn how to achieve it by going to this course.

CCM 140: UNIT REPRESENTATIVE PROGRAM

Learn about the benefits of the OA Troop Representative program for your Chapter and Troops, and learn how to support and develop the representative.

COLLEGE FOR THE NEW ARROWMAN (CNA)

This college is designed for new Arrowmen that are Ordeal members of the OA. To earn a New Arrowmen College Associate Degree you must take CNA 100 and two other courses from the New Arrowmen or General Studies courses listed below.

CNA 100: THE OA IN NUTSHELL

Confused about the Order's structure and where you lie in it? After this course, you will understand how the Order is run and how important you are to its success.

CNA 110: BROTHERHOOD BOUND

This course is designed for new Ordeal members of the OA. It will allow you to reflect on your Scout life and character, learn of the significance of attaining Brotherhood and outline the "Trail to Brotherhood."

GENERAL STUDIES (GS)

This college is designed for Arrowmen that haven't decided on a major yet. To earn a General Studies Associate Degree you must take three courses from three different colleges, one course per college. The GS courses are also listed in different colleges as they can be used to fulfill requirements for those colleges.

GS 100: DYNAMICS OF LEADERSHIP

Learn about your own leadership styles, understand the interpersonal skills and how to use them effectively, and understand how you set the example and how your example affects others.

GS 110: WORKING WITH ADULTS

This course is designed for youth who want to learn about each other's role in the OA and methods to help build stronger relationships between them.

GS 120: WORKING WITH YOUTH

This course is designed for advisers who want to learn about each other's role in the OA and methods to help build stronger relationships between them.

GS 130: UTILIZING THE INTERNET

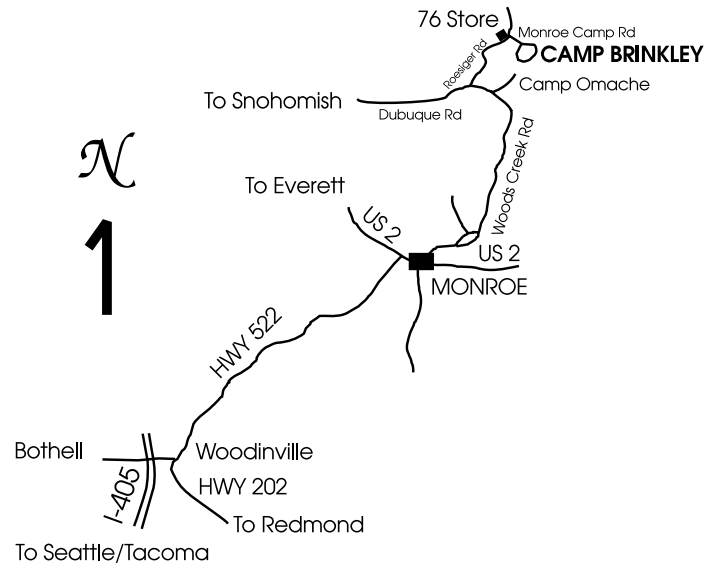

How to get to Camp Brinkley

From Everett: Take I-5 to US-2 exit and go east.

From Seattle: Take I-405 to Hwy 522 (Lake City/Bothell Way). Follow 522 to Monroe. Off the exit ramp turn left onto US -2. Turn left at Woods Creek Road at the "Red Barn" deli and Texaco station. At the first fork in the road keep right. At the next stop sign, head straight on Woods Creek Road. Follow the road several miles past "St. Nick's tree's" and the Camp Omache entrance. Take the next major right onto Roesiger Road and keep right when the road forks. Turn right at the Lake Roesiger Store (76 Station) onto Monroe Camp Road. Keep right at the camp entrance sign and follow road into parking lot.
